Cosmos: This flower adds variety and beauty, representing harmony and tranquility. Both flowers are easy to grow and provide color in gardens until the first frost of fall.

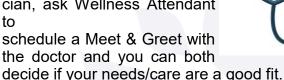

While raw kale is healthiest, it can be enjoyed steamed, baked into chips, blended into smoothies, or added to dishes like burgers and pesto. Paper Alchemy

World Origami Days, celebrated from October 24 to November 11 (Origami

Day in Japan), honor the ancient art of paper folding. Originating in China around AD 105, origami spread globally and remains popular today. In the 1950s, Lillian Oppenheimer helped popularize origami in America, and her birthday marks the start of the celebration. Events include seminars, exhibits, and folding classes. Whether crafting a frog, fan, or hat, origami offers both creative joy and tactile challenge.

The Bright Side of October

Orange is a defining color of fall, especially in October, seen in leaves, pumpkins, and Halloween décor. Its name entered English in the 1300s via Old French and Arabic, originally referring to the fruit. Before that, the color was called "yellow-red." Orange symbolizes warmth and energy, making it a perfect match for Halloween's black. The tradition of carving jack-o'-lanterns shifted from turnips in Ireland to pumpkins in America due to their abundance and vibrant hue. Beyond Halloween, orange appears in seasonal foods, clothing, and deco-

rations, evoking harvest and autumn coziness. Though only five percent favor it year-round, orange shines brightly in fall's spotlight.



Making Homemade Kale Chips

Preheat the oven to 350°F. In a bowl or plastic bag, mix together one bunch of destemmed kale, 1 T. olive oil, and 1 t. salt until the kale is evenly coated. Place coated kale in a single layer on parchment paper on a baking sheet. Bake for 10 to 15 minutes until crispy. Let the kale cool for about 3 minutes and then enjoy your batch of nutritious kale chips.
